POSITION SUMMARY:

As a member of a multi-disciplinary team, the Vector Borne Diseases (VBD) Technician provides support and assistance to the Environmental Health team for the VBD Surveillance Program. Duties include mosquito trapping; trap site identification/mapping; maintaining equipment; and report preparation and presentation to staff, community groups and the public. This position will also be involved in Planetary Health promotion activities. All work is consistent with the mission, vision, values, strategic priorities, policies, and standards of the Board of Health.
