Re:	Updates to Tuberculosis (TB) Screening Recommendations for Long-Term Care Homes and Retirement Homes in the NBPSDHU area

Dear Health Care System Partners,

The Health Unit has updated recommendations for screening of residents being admitted to Long-Term Care Homes and Retirement Homes to align with guidance provided in the <u>8th</u> <u>Edition of the Canadian Tuberculosis Standards (2022)</u> and considering the low incidence of Tuberculosis in our area.

Please see the accompanying document titled, "Tuberculosis (TB) Screening Recommendations for Long-Term Care Home (LTCH) and Retirement Home (RH) Residents".

Highlights of the changes include no longer recommending a PA and Lateral chest x-ray for residents over 65 years of age or Tuberculin Skin Tests for residents less than 65 years of age being admitted to LTCHs/RHs. All residents are recommended to have an assessment of likelihood of respiratory TB and a symptom screen to rule out active TB, preferably prior to and on admission.
